Latest News from Fates Warning

Over the months, the *Ivory*Tower has received numerous letters from fans requesting information on Fates Warning's origins. In response to these many questions, *IT* presents a two-part minihistory of FW. In the first installment, we'll take a look at the beginnings of the band.

Fates Warning: The Early Years

Fates Warning's saga began in 1983, when Jim Matheos answered an ad which had been placed by Steve Zimmerman and another area musician in the Hartford-based local paper The Advocate. The band played covers of

Iron Maiden, Scorpions, Judas Priest, and Black Sabbath, among others. Jim, who was eager to perform original material, soon tired of playing covers exclusively and quit the band. Steve and Jim decided to regroup, and in the summer of 1983 were joined by Joe DiBiase on bass, Vic Arduini on guitars and John Arch on Vocals. Fates Warning was born.

The members saved money from their daytime jobs, and produced their first six-song demo in the Fall of '83. This was followed by the appearance of "Soldier Boy" on a 1984 compilation by Metal Blade Records entitled Metal Massacre V. Because of the enthusiastic response, Fates landed a recording contract with Metal Blade. Their debut album, Night on Bröcken, was released in 1984. It featured the poetic lyrics and complex melodies that were to become the band's trademark.

The Spectre Within was released in 1985. It was well received by critics and progressive metal fans, and Fates embarked on its first tour to promote the album. Yet, despite the critical

acclaim, the band received little support and soon ended the tour. Vic Arduini left Fates, and the band began working on material for what would become Awaken the Guardian. It was their most ambitious project to date, and the band postponed its search for a replacement for Vic in order to devote their time and energy to Guardian. As the time to record drew near, the search for a new guitarist began in earnest. Fates eventually chose Frank Aresti, who had been playing in a local thrash band.

In the summer of 1986, Awaken the Guardian was recorded. It proved to be Fates most successful album up to that time, entering Bill-board's Top 200 chart. Equally importantly, the album marked a stylistic turning point for the band, for with Guardian Fates finally found the musical voice it had been searching for in its earlier works. All appeared to be going well for the band, when what would have been a disaster for any other band happened...


